Purpose

Solely enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops

What are Specialty Crops?

- Specialty crops are defined by USDA as fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture and nursery crops (including floriculture).

 Base Grant = Value of specialty crop production

Eligibility

- Entities:
 - Non-Profit and For-Profit
 - Local, State, Federal and Tribal Governments
 - Colleges and Universities

Funds **cannot** benefit a single organization, institution, or individual.

Review Criteria and Process

- Goal is to fund projects that produce the highest degree of measurable benefits to California specialty crops in relation to each dollar spent.
- Two Levels of Review
 - I. Administrative Internal
 - 2. Technical External

Concept Proposal

- Compelling snapshot of the proposal
- Clearly and concisely conveys need and impact

Flat Rates


- Flat Rate Estimate
- Basis for Estimate
 - $_{\circ}$ Timeframe
 - Length of Service
- Prior Approval Required

Project Examples - Acceptable

- A non-profit requests funding to contract with a university to conduct research on the feasibility of planting, cultivating, and growing a specialty crop in a particular area; results of which can be shared with many growers throughout the state.
- A non-profit organization requests funds to conduct an advertising campaign to benefit specialty crop members.

Project Examples - Unacceptable

- A specialty crop producer requests funds to promote their asparagus at a roadside stand.
- A sole proprietor requests grant funds to redesign his/her logo in order to make his/her specialty crop value-added product stand out at the local farmers market.
