2014/2015 Budget Review

CPDPC Budget

The program collected \$431,848 in revenues in the month of August for a new total of \$13,808,826 for current year which represents about 95 percent of the total projected revenue. We are receiving revenue at a rate of about 6 percent more than projected. There has been \$836,382 in expenditures in September 2015, making the total expenditures year to date \$12,880,500. The new budget balance is \$4,273,695.

CHRP Budgets

The total executed budget from CHRP per the original agreement and the augmentation is \$10,844,701. There was \$922,164 in expenditures in September, making the new total expenditures \$7,744,529. There is a new balance to go of \$1,880,330.

Other Budgets

There were no changes to the TASC Grant, Citrus Commodity Survey or the NIFA Funds budgets. There was an expenditure on the HLB MAC funds in the amount of \$3,427 bringing the year to date on that budget to \$12,857 with a balance to go of \$88,513.

2015/2016 Projections

Budget Projections No changes were presented form the approved budgets and no expenditures have been billed yet.

Spending Authority

The CDFA will track the authority and notify the Committee when we are at 50 percent of the allotted authority.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 a.m. There will not be a meeting in December, but the next meeting will be held in January.
