

## Selling Type A Medicated Articles

Type A medicated articles are considered restricted livestock drugs in California. These products are not considered a feed although they are intended to be mixed in feed. To sell a Type A medicated article directly to a producer, the facility must hold a Restricted Livestock Drug License with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA).

Per the requirements for a Restricted Livestock Drug Licensee, sales records of the following information are required:

- Purchaser name, address, phone number, and signature
- Product name (drug or trade name)
- Route of administration
- Quantity and lot number
- Date of sale
- Intended species (recommended)
- Purchaser email (recommended)

A purchaser is required to have a Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD) order to feed a product that contains a VFD drug. The purchaser must maintain a copy of the VFD on their premises in order to feed the product once it is mixed in the animal feed.
