Background

Pursuant to requirements set forth in California Government Code Section 16428.86(a), (i.e. SB 859, Section 6), a project shall not receive funding through the Dairy Digester Research and Development Program (DDRDP) unless the applicant has demonstrated to California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) that the applicant has done all of the following:

- Conducted outreach in areas that will potentially be adversely impacted by the proposed project.
- · Determined potential adverse impacts of the project.
- · Committed to measures to mitigate impacts.

CDFA shall review the applicant's analysis identifying potential adverse impacts of the proposed project when making awards.

Services Provided

CDFA is partnering with California State University-Sacramento Consensus and Collaboration Program (CCP) to serve as a resource for potential DDRDP applicants to support community outreach efforts.
