SUBJECT: California Redemption Value (CRV) and Similar Overcharges

The question was brought before the CACASA Laws and Regulations Committee regarding Business and Professions Code Section 12024.2 and excessive or non-authorized recycling redemption charges on beverage containers. The concern is over the requirement that the value must be advertised posted or quoted before there can be a violation of Section 12024.2.

It is the opinion of this Division that the Division of Recycling controls the CRV fees found in Section 14560 (3) of the Public Resources Code. The values are represented in statutes, in public messages, in news releases, and on the World Wide Web and are therefore both authorized by law and posted by the entity authorized by law to do so. Complaints received concerning incorrect CRV charges demonstrate the postings are effective in informing the public. Section 14561 also requires that containers be individually marked if the specified CRV applies.

It is a violation of Section 12024.2 to charge more for the purchase of an item than its represented price plus these posted, advertised, and authorized CRV values. To support weights and measures officials, the Division of Recycling has also responded to the Committee's request with plans to require the amount of the redemption value be posted in each store, possibly with a few exceptions. A draft sample is enclosed. We believe actions can be taken for overcharges, those that exceed the authorized rates or are collected on non-qualified containers, even if the store does not post these signs.

When the required signs are not posted, enforcement actions may best include a statement from a competent representative from the Division of Recycling that a particular location is indeed collecting a value greater than authorized by the corresponding CRV for the item.
