

**Veterinary Services Grant Program Rural Practice Enhancement** Funding for food animal practices available now!

## Are you a veterinarian or veterinary staff currently providing food animal veterinary services in a designated, rural\* veterinary shortage area? If so, you may be eligible to apply for funding!

**What is the grant award?** \$75,000-\$125,000 in funding to equip veterinary facilities, share in reasonable overhead, and establish mobile facilities to address education or extension needs. Note: Grant funds cannot be used for building construction or remodeling.

**Service Commitment:** Three (3) years of service are required in a designated shortage situation for food and large animal services.

### Examples of business expenses covered by the program:



Hiring additional staff



Purchasing portable stocks to expand practice services



Acquire or rent additional pregnancy and semen testing equipment



Adding a second vehicle equipped for ambulatory services to support another associate



Upgrade facilities to include roll-over chute and portable radiography equipment



\*As designated by the Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program (VMLRP) and Veterinary Services Grant Program (VSGP). Rural eligibility is determined by the <u>USDA Rural</u> <u>Development Business Program's Rural Community Development Initiative Map</u>.

# **BRIEF APPLICATION OVERVIEW**

### Application and Award Timeline

By end of March: Application deadline typically announced  $\checkmark$ 

At least 5 weeks prior to application deadline: Register for the System for Award Management (Sam.gov) and Grants.gov

<u>6-8 weeks after submission</u>: Initial Screening and Peer Review processes typically completed, after which applicants are notified about funding awards.

<u>Around September</u>: Awards are granted after Administrative Review.

### Application Requirements

- Map of shortage area and clinic location
- Project Narrative
- Budget: Detailed outline of award spending plan (with overhead costs not to exceed 50% of funds)
- Post-Award documentation required
