



## Notice of Required Action (Pursuant to Quarantine) Attachment F: Lactating Dairy Cattle Fair Entry Requirements

***Quarantined Fair premises will be required to adhere to the following restrictions and conditions:***

- **All lactating dairy cows entering the premises, listed on issued Notice of Required Action, are required to adhere to the following:**
  1. Provide a negative (polymerase chain reactant) PCR test for H5N1 on milk pursuant to the following and following the procedures listed below (testing procedure\*):
    - A. A Category II accredited veterinarian must oversee or collect samples from each lactating animal traveling to the exhibition
    - B. Samples must be collected no more than seven (7) days prior to the animal arriving on the exhibition site.
    - C. Samples must be sent to a National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) laboratory like the California Animal Health and Food Safety laboratory ([CAHFS-UC Davis](#)).
    - D. Individual official animal identification must match the identification on the test results paperwork.
    - E. If any of the milk samples test positive for H5N1, all dairy cattle at the premises shall be prohibited from participating in the exhibition.
  2. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection
    - A. Lactating dairy cattle can move intrastate to attend fairs on the same negative results for seven (7) days from date of collection to locations specified on the CVI. If going to multiple exhibitions within that time, all locations where the animal will be unloaded must be indicated on the CVI.
    - B. The CVI must include this statement: *“The animals on this CVI do not originate from a herd with active confirmed cases of H5N1 virus infection nor from a premises with any cattle showing signs consistent with H5N1 infection.”*
    - C. The CVI can act as record of a negative PCR test for H5N1 if the test information and accession number is included on the CVI. Otherwise, the test results should be attached to the CVI.
- **All live calving and calving events on fairgrounds are prohibited.**



**\*CAHFS Testing Procedure and Submission Process:**

1. Test all individual lactating dairy exhibition cattle attending a fair.
2. Wash and disinfect teats before sample collection. Collect a minimum of seven milliliters (7mls) of milk with equal amounts from all functional quarters into one tube. (Use a 10-15 ml sterile screw top tube/vial. DO NOT use snap cap vials or red top blood collection tubes.)
3. Complete a [Laboratory Submission Form](#) Select Non-Monitored Herd Surveillance, write in the History section, "Fair Test."
4. Scan or take a picture of the laboratory submission form and e-mail the form with the animal's official individual Identification Numbers (IDs) and include shipping tracking numbers (when available) to:
