Equine Emergency

Evacuation Kit



Be prepared for an emergency with a horse evacuation kit and assemble the kit well in advance of any emergency such as wildfires, floods, debris flows, etc.

Feed and Water 7-10 days of feed and water (check feed expiration date and rotate as needed) O Hay nets that can be filled prior to evacuation O Water buckets O Feed tubs or nose bags General Supplies O Duct tape Flashlight O Pocket knife or multitool O Paper towels Cloth towels O Blankets O Battery-operated radio with extra batteries O Shovel O Tarps Heavy gloves Trash bags Trash cans with lids Twine Wire cutters O Cattle/animal weatherproof marking crayons or sprays Documentation O Insurance contact information O Veterinary records for each horse O Veterinary/pharmacy contact information O Proof of ownership O Current photographs of each horse O Proof of negative Coggins tests for each horse O Detailed instructions for each horse with special needs O Map of the local area and evacuation routes

Horse Care Supplies Bandanas/blindfolds (if necessary) O Blankets O Fly spray O Grooming/hoof care materials Characteristics Leg wraps O Portable livestock panels O Restraints (leather or breakaway halters, lariats, leads, ropes, etc.) O Water buckets First Aid and Healthcare Items 2-week supply of supplements/medications (check expiration date and rotate as needed) Equine First Aid Kit including: ■ Betadine ☐ Wound salve or spray ☐ Thermometer ■ Eyewash ☐ Leg wraps/elastic bandages, bandagetape and scissors ☐ Gauze squares □ Cotton bandage rolls ■ Latex gloves ☐ Isopropyl alcohol/alcohol prep pads ☐ Saline solution □ Towels and washcloths ■ Tweezers ☐ Fly spray ☐ Hoof pick, rasp and nippers for removing shoes □ Twitch ☐ Medication instructions for each horse identified
