APPLICATION FOR DESIGNATED PEN STATUS

I/We, hereby request the approval of the pens numbered _____

as designated pens for feeding restricted cattle known to be exposed to **tuberculosis** and/or **brucellosis** in compliance with California Department of Food and Agriculture tuberculosis regulations (CCR 758.1) and/or brucellosis regulations.

I/We, do hereby agree to:

1. Separate all designated pens and areas by double fencing with at least 30 feet of unoccupied area between the fences; this separation can be an alley if cattle are not kept in the alley.
2. Not allow restricted and non-restricted cattle to share watering systems or feed troughs.
3. Not allow pasturing or grazing of the restricted cattle (UM&R, 2005).
4. Move each shipment of restricted cattle to the premises with a "Permit for Movement of Restricted Species" (VS 1-27) or, when approved by CDFA, on a monthly facility management record report, which includes the number of cattle, their official individual animal identification and the date of the shipment.
5. Designate a responsible employee(s) to sign the VS 1-27 or record the shipment on a facility management record report with the number of animals in each shipment, the date of arrival, assigned lot and/or pen numbers and a list of the official individual animal identification.
6. Permanently identify all restricted cattle with lot tags upon entry into the designated pens.
7. Unload the restricted cattle and move them directly into the designated pens. Not use common receiving areas for restricted cattle unless we clean and disinfect them with an approved disinfectant before use for non-restricted cattle.
8. Notify the CDFA District Office when we receive restricted cattle at the premises.
9. Record mortality of any restricted cattle with date of death and official individual animal identification in the monthly facility management record report.
10. Clean and disinfect common processing areas and/or equipment used for processing or treating restricted cattle with an approved disinfectant before use for non-restricted cattle.
11. Require workers coming in direct contact with restricted cattle to change outerwear and disinfect their boots before moving to an area with non-restricted cattle.
12. Move each shipment of restricted cattle from the premises directly to a USDA-inspected slaughter facility for regular slaughter inspection, or to other designated pens, or to an approved terminal feedlot with either a VS 1-27 or when approved by CDFA, on a monthly facility

management record report which includes the number of cattle, their official individual animal identification, the date of the shipment and the destination.

- 13. Send copies of all monthly facility management record reports for the restricted cattle to the CDFA District Office.
- 14. Allow CDFA/USDA personnel to periodically inspect the restricted cattle, the designated pens and review all associated records.
- 15. Maintain records of all restricted cattle for 5 years.

I have read and understand the above provisions and acknowledge receipt of a copy of the California Department of Food and Agriculture tuberculosis regulations (CCR 758.1) and/or brucellosis regulations.
