Swine Entry Requirements (Breeding, Feeding, Exhibition, and Companions/Pets)



Entry Documentation (3 CCR §796.4, §796.5, FAC10781)

Certificate of Veterinary Inspections (CVI): Required. Swine must be inspected within 30 days of movement into the state.

CVI Exemptions: Swine moving directly to a recognized slaughter facility

Interstate Livestock Entry Permit: Required for <u>ALL</u> swine. Entry permits are valid for 15 days, including the day of issuance.

Permit Exemptions:

- Swine moving directly to a recognized slaughter facility
- Swine used exclusively for exhibition and returning to California without change of ownership within 14 calendar days of leaving California

No testing or vaccinations are required at this time.

Official Identification (ID) (3 CCR §796.4-796.6, FAC10781)

<u>ALL</u> swine require individual official ID, and it must be listed on the CVI.

Exemptions:

- Slaughter swine born and raised on the same premises, not mixed with swine from other premises, and moved in a group directly to a recognized slaughter facility from the place where they were raised
- Swine moving directly to an approved livestock market from farm of origin
