(2) <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>

Vote to approve meeting minutes from March 21, 2025.

Motion #1: Mr. Glenn Hickman made a motion to accept the minutes. Mr. Mike Sencer seconded the motion. All members agreed with no abstentions. The motion passed unanimously.

(3) PROPOSITION 12 BORDER STATION INSPECTIONS

Presentation of Border Patrol Stations (BPS) enforcement statistics for holds placed on egg loads and BOLO (Be On the Look Out) stops for 2025. Discussion of the value of BPS enforcement and deterrent factors for noncompliant shipments. Comparison of Proposition 12 (Prop 12) and Shell Egg Food Safety (SEFS) BPS checks and their respective paperwork. As Prop 12 enforcement is still in its infancy and focuses primarily on pork, Prop 12 BPS checks for egg shipments only ask for the Bills of Lading. SEFS checks maintain a stricter checklist of requirements for egg shipments and record quantitative data and photographs for the Egg Safety Quality Management (ESQM) program.

Discussion of possibly replacing BPS checks with random stop-and-checks or reducing BPS requirements in the future, if compliance is high. Prop 12 BPS check items could be added to SEFS checks to split the BPS contract costs, but would present issues with separating Prop 12 egg data from pork and veal data, as well as logistical concerns if a shipment is compliant with one program but not the other; perhaps most importantly, the SEFS program would only save a minimal amount since BPS labor for Prop 12 egg checks is limited at this time. As Prop 12 program expands their enforcement actions and correspondingly requests more labor in their BPS contract, it would be more opportune to discuss the two programs' overlap at that time.

Plan for BPS to meet with ESQM program and Prop 12 program to discuss overlap; the proportion of the contract budget that would be assigned to each program for their respective checklist items; the possibility of combining the two checks; and the potential challenges of retraining BPS staff.

(4) ESQM BUDGET APPROVAL

Vote to approve BPS contract budget item for \$333,051.

Motion #2: Mr. David Will made a motion to accept the proposal. Mr. Hickman seconded the motion. All members agreed with no abstentions. The motion passed unanimously.

(5) PROPOSITION 12 ADVISORY BOARD DISCUSSION

For the Board's awareness, asked Prop 12 staff if they have an advisory board for their program – there is not currently one. Was previously discussed before Prop 12 was passed to form a board with egg, pork and veal producers and animal activists but was not added to Prop 12 legislation. Would need to be an industry-led push for legislation, adding it to the original proposition.

Discussion of streamlining SEFS and Prop 12 on-site inspections to be conducted simultaneously; however, SEFS inspections are conducted on a risk-based schedule,

unlike Prop 12 inspections which are at least every 12 months. Inquiry into expanding 12-month renewal minimum for Prop 12 inspections and amending the requirement to inspect every structure on each property. Ultimately all amendments would need to be established by legislation; industry is encouraged to voice concerns when Prop 12 regulations are being reviewed.
