Central California Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals **\$35,200**

Fixin' Fresno - No Nuts Left Behind

Central California SPCA wishes to offer the residents of the city of Fresno who are located in areas of high stray cat/dog populations subsidized low cost cat and dog spay/neuters for a total of 600 spay/neuter surgeries in one year's time.

FixNation, Inc **\$50,000**

Community Cat Program

As a key part of FixNation's mission to reduce homeless cat overpopulation throughout greater Los Angeles, FixNation operates a free full-time spay/neuter clinic for community cats from throughout Los Angeles City and County.

Valley Oak Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals **\$43,756.44**

Pet Lover's Spay/Neuter Program

Valley Oak SPCA Veterinary Clinic will provide alteration surgeries for the dogs and cats of low-income residents of Tulare County. The project will also provide Trap Neuter Return (TNR) services for feral cats at no cost.

Sacramento SPCA **\$40,905**

Feral and Community Cat Clinic

The Sacramento SPCA Feral and Community Cat Clinic aims to reduce the overpopulation of feral cats in the greater Sacramento region by providing them with spay/neuter procedures and returning them to their colonies.

Critters Without Litters **\$49,800**

Fix Before Six Program

Critters Without Litters is requesting a second year of Pet Lover's Grant Program funds to continue providing subsidized spay/neuter services for pets under the age of six months so that the cost to the pet owner to have their pet sterilized is \$20.

City of San Jose Animal Care & Services Division **\$50,000**

2Tiny Kitten Village Project

The 2Tiny Kitten Village Project incentivizes community cat rescue groups to pull more kittens from the shelter during kitten season by offering a free spay/neuter voucher coupon to

rescue groups for every shelter kitten they pull. The surgeries are performed by contract veterinarians at the in-house public spay/neuter clinic or by veterinarians at partner clinics.

City of Moreno Valley - Animal Services Division **\$26,000**

"PAWS!! – MoVal" – Pets Altered Wear Smiles!! – Moreno Valley

Grant funding will be allocated directly to both free and subsidized spay/neuter programs administered by Moreno Valley Animal Services.

Spay Neuter Project of Los Angeles **\$17,500**

High Volume, Accessible Spay Neuter of Public Animals in Los Angeles

Spay Neuter Project of Los Angeles (SNPLA) is the largest spay/neuter provider in Los Angeles. In order to increase the number of spayed and neutered animals in Los Angeles and reduce shelter intake and euthanasia, the project seeks funding to support the highly subsidized spay/neuter surgery of 500 cats and dogs owned by members of the public.

Humane Society Silicon Valley **\$16,838.56**

Milpitas Community Cat Project

Humane Society Silicon Valley (HSSV) is seeking funding for an innovative targeted Trap Neuter Return (TNR) program for community cats in Milpitas, CA. This program, which is derived from supporting research and community data, differs from traditional TNR programs in that it focuses on moving methodically through the community to spay/neuter as many cats living in individual colonies as possible.
