Dear Governor Brown:

The State Board of Food and Agriculture has had a series of meetings focused on your Water Action Plan, response to the drought and efforts to successfully develop comprehensive groundwater legislation. I write to inform you of an action taken by the Board with respect to pending groundwater legislative proposals.

The Board supports groundwater legislation constructed around the following criteria:

- Empowerment of local agencies to effectively and sustainably manage the groundwater resources in critically over-drafted basins around the state and principally in the Central Valley.
- Establishment of a clear role for the Department of Water Resources to provide technical assistance to local groundwater management agencies and measure progress toward sustainable management objectives.
- Creation of a finely crafted, limited role of oversight for the State Water Resources
  Control Board that includes clear milestones and carefully developed criteria for state
  intervention in the event no local agencies are tasked with responsibility for managing
  groundwater or when local agencies fail to achieve important milestones along the way
  to sustainability.

Any legislation developed or supported by the Administration must recognize that circumstances among and between groundwater basins vary and that management is best left to local agencies. Such legislation should also minimize costs and uncertainty for water users and include streamlined and fair processes for resolving conflicts that arise from new regulations.

Governor, it is very important for you to make clear that your interest in groundwater legislation is only a part of an overarching strategy to implement all of the features of your Water Action Plan, including, but not limited to, developing appropriate additional storage, improving and rationalizing Delta operations and developing appropriate funding mechanisms to achieve your objectives. The Board understands the urgency of passing a bond that addresses these issues and we stand ready to assist you in this effort.
