

# **Sheep Entry Requirements**

California requires an Interstate Livestock Entry Permit for sheep moving into the state.

### **Exemptions:**

 Ewes less than 18 months of age that have not lambed, have not aborted, or are not pregnant and moving directly to a state or federally approved slaughter facility.

To obtain an Interstate Livestock Entry Permit, please contact the Animal Health Branch (AHB) permit line at (916) 900-5052 before moving sheep into the state. Permits are valid for 15 days after being issued.

California requires a **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)** issued within 30 days before entry with the statement, "The animals are not scrapie-positive or suspect or from a scrapie non-compliant flock."

#### **Exemptions:**

 All sheep going directly to a state or federally approved slaughter facility.

#### **Ovine Brucellosis - Rams**

A negative brucella ovis test is required for all rams 6 months of age and older within 60 days prior to entry.

## Exemptions:

- A California ram that is entered in a show or sale out of state, and then returns to California.
- Rams from a certified brucella ovis-free flock.



If you are transporting livestock into California with an electronic CVI, please print and present a hard copy to the Inspector at the Border Protection Station. This will prevent future follow up by CDFA personnel to verify the authenticity and accuracy of the document.

<u>Information About Livestock and Pet Movement</u> or Animal Health Entry Requirement Interactive Website California requires all sheep imported into the state to bear **Official Identification (ID)**. Official ID must be an identification mark or device approved by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The ID must be written on, or included on a list attached to the CVI. Official ID may be listed as a range of numbers.

Acceptable forms of official animal ID include:

- Official eartags that provide unique identification for the individual animal. It must bear the U.S. shield, be tamper resistant, have a high retention rate, and conform to one of the following numbering systems:
  - ⇒ Flock ID tags (flock ID with Individual Animal ID on tag),
  - ⇒ Scrapie program tags,
  - $\Rightarrow$  Serial ID tags (State code with serials numbers and letters), or
  - ⇒ Animal Identification Number (AIN) (RFID or visual).
- USDA compliant microchips
- · Official tattoos:
  - ⇒ Flock ID with Individual Animal ID, or
  - ⇒ Registration tattoo, if recorded in a Purebred Registry Association Book with documentation attached to the CVI.

#### **Exemptions:**

- Ewes less than 18 months of age that have not lambed, have not aborted, or are not pregnant, and moving directly to a state or federally approved slaughter facility.
- Castrated sheep less than 18 months of age, except those for exhibition.
