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AMENDED NOTICE OF REQUIRED ACTION PURSUANT TO QUARANTINE

Owner: **Owners of poultry** species (including chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, partridges, pheasants, quail, guinea fowl, peafowl (peacocks), doves, pigeons, grouse, swans, and ratites) within the designated disease control areas described, including, but not limited to, hobby and pet poultry owners, feed stores or other retail stores with live poultry, and commercial poultry facilities.

Address: **Designated Disease Control Areas in San Bernardino and Riverside Counties:**

1. **Muscoy area** circumscribed by Institution Road from Cajon Wash to Interstate 215; from that point, south on Interstate 215 to Highway 210; from there, west on Highway 210 to the Lytle Creek Floodway; and then northwest along the Lytle Creek Floodway and then Cajon Wash to its approximate intersection with Institution Road.
2. **Mira Loma area** circumscribed on the north by Pomona Freeway (Highway 60) from Interstate 15 east to Pyrite St; then south on Pyrite St. 0.95 miles to Jurupa Rd; west on Jurupa Rd. for 1.38 miles to Van Buren Blvd; south on Van Buren Blvd for 2.62 miles to the Santa Ana River; continue west along the Santa Ana River to Interstate 15, then north on Interstate 15 for 5 miles to where Interstate 15 intersects with Highway 60.
3. **Perris area** circumscribed on the north by Moreno Valley Freeway (Highway 60) starting at split off Interstate 215 and east for 6.5 miles; then north on Moreno Beach Dr for 0.48 miles; east on Ironwood Ave for 1.74 miles; south on Sinclair St for 0.48 miles, east on Highway 60 for 1.98 miles, southeast on Gillman Springs Road for 12.3 miles; continue south on State St/South State St for 8.3 miles; west on Domenigoni Pkwy for 7 miles; south on Winchester Rd (Highway 79) for 2.14 miles; southeast on Washington Rd for 3.16 miles; west on Thompson Rd 2.05 miles; west on Max Gillis Blvd 0.43 miles; southwest on Leon Rd 0.20 miles; south on Briggs Rd 0.23 miles; west on Los Alamos Rd 1.65 miles; north on Menifee Rd 0.10 miles; west on Clinton Keith Rd 5.3 miles; northwest on Interstate 15 (8.3 miles); southwest on 3rd St for 0.4 miles; south-west for 0.08 miles onto the Pasadena St- Lake Elsinore Levee Regional Trail; northwest on this trail for 0.74 miles; northeast on Riverside Drive (Highway 74) for 0.46 miles; northwest on Interstate 15 for 14 miles; east on Cajalco Rd for 3.7 miles; north on La Sierra Ave for 4.6 miles; northeast on Victoria Ave for 5.18 miles; southeast on Washington St for 0.8 miles; east on Overlook Pkwy for 2.8 miles; southeast on Alessandro Blvd for 0.87 miles; east on Alessandro Blvd/ East Alessandro Blvd for 3.15 miles; north on Interstate 215 for 2 miles.
4. **Ontario Area** circumscribed on the north by East Riverside Drive starting at the junction with Euclid Ave and east for 5.3 miles; south on Hammer Ave for 2.0 miles; west on East Eucalyptus Ave/ Eucalyptus Ave for 2.0 miles; south on Archibald Ave for 0.50 miles; west on Merrill Ave for 3.3 miles; North on Euclid Ave for 2.5 miles.

You are hereby notified that the State Veterinarian has imposed a Quarantine pursuant to Food and Agricultural Code, Section 9562 on the following population of animals and animal products:

Description of Population of Animals and Animal Products: **Poultry species (including chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, partridges, pheasants, quail, guinea fowl, peafowl (peacocks), doves, pigeons, grouse, swans, and ratites), poultry products including eggs, manure/fertilizer, and used equipment or other items that could be contaminated due to exposure to poultry or poultry manure.**

Present Location: **In those areas of San Bernardino and Riverside Counties as described above.**

Reason for Quarantine: This Quarantine is imposed because the population of animals and animal products described above may be infected with **virulent Newcastle disease virus (VND)** or may have been exposed to VND and can transmit an illness that could kill or seriously damage other birds, or may be at risk for such exposure.

Required Action: Pursuant to California Food and Agricultural Code Section 9562 and Title 3, California Code of Regulations, Section 1301 et seq., require the following:

- **Hold** the population of animals and animal products described above **on the premises where it is now located.**
- **Segregate and Isolate** the population of animals and animal products described above from other animals or products no later than: **9:00 PM on February 8, 2019.**
 - **The method of isolation shall be confinement to one premises in a pen, cage or other means that prevents poultry from moving off the premises.**
 - **No poultry or hatching eggs shall be moved onto the premises and no poultry, poultry products, used poultry equipment or other items that could spread disease due to contact with poultry or poultry manure shall be moved off the premises until this quarantine is rescinded or revised; or unless the owner has signed a compliance agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) and such movement is made using a CDFA or United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) movement permit.**
 - **All owners shall immediately report any clinical signs suggestive of VND (described on CDFA website at https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/ahfss/Animal_Health/newcastle_disease_info.html and any unexpected decreases in egg production or increase in mortality (above expected rate for strain and age) by phone to the sick bird hot line at (866) 922-2473 or California State Veterinarian at (916) 900-5000.**
- **Euthanize and Dispose** of the population of poultry that cannot be isolated as described above. Due to the high risk of exposure to VND in the above designated disease control areas, CDFA or USDA will assist with euthanasia if poultry are free roaming and not isolated as described by **9:00 AM on February 10, 2019.**

The California State Veterinarian may modify the action(s) required in this Notice. Failure to comply with this Notice of Required Action is a violation of Title 3, California Code of Regulations, Section 1301.8 and will result in the Department of Food and Agriculture pursuing appropriate remedies, including but not limited to law enforcement involvement, and may interfere with your receiving indemnity payments to which you might be entitled.

YOUR APPEAL RIGHTS: You may appeal this amendment and request an informal hearing if an informal hearing was not requested based on any earlier Notice and if this Notice requires that a population of animals or animal product be destroyed and the previous Notice required a different action. Your appeal is pursuant to Chapter 4.5 (commencing with Section 11400) of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code and Title 3, California Code of Regulations, Section 1301.2 and 1301.3. You may appeal by contacting the **State Veterinarian** at cdfa.qna@cdfa.ca.gov and requesting an informal hearing. Due to the immediate need to contain this outbreak, **YOUR REQUEST FOR A HEARING MUST BE RECEIVED NO LATER THAN 9:00 AM ON February 10, 2019.**
