Sheep Entry Requirements



Entry Documentation (3 CCR § 760.5)

Certificate of Veterinary Inspections (CVI): Required. Sheep must be inspected within 30 days of movement into the state and the CVI must include the statement: "The animals are not scrapie positive, suspect, or from a scrapie non-complaint flock".

CVI Exemptions:

- Sheep moving within an approved slaughter channel that have not lambed, aborted, or are pregnant
- Sheep moving for grazing without change of
- ownership (pasture move)

Interstate Livestock Entry Permit: Required for <u>ALL</u> sheep. Entry permits are valid for 15 days, including the day of issuance.

Permit Exemptions:

- Sheep less than 18 months of age that are moving within an approved slaughter channel that have not lambed, aborted, or are pregnant
- Sheep used exclusively for exhibition and returning to California without change of ownership within 14 calendar days of leaving California

Official Identification (ID) (3 CCR § 760.5)

<u>ALL</u> sheep require individual official ID, and it must be listed on the CVI. Exemptions:



- Castrated sheep (wethers) less than 18 months of age that are not for exhibition/show
- Sheep less than 18 months of age in an approved slaughter channel that have not lambed, aborted, or are pregnant
- Sheep moving for grazing without change of ownership (pasture move)

Ovine Brucellosis (3 CCR §760.4)

A negative *Brucella ovis* test is required for all rams six (6) months of age and over within 60 days prior to entry. The CVI <u>MUST</u> include the test date, test result, and laboratory name.



Exemption for Rams:

- Moving directly to slaughter
- If from a certified Brucella ovis free flock with flock number on the CVI
- A California origin ram that is entered in a show or sale out of state, and then returns to California
- · Moving for grazing without change of ownership
