

EXHIBIT: Citrus – H HARVESTER / FARM LABOR CONTRACTOR

PROVISIONS FOR THE HARVESTERS AND FARM LABOR CONTRACTORS TO HARVEST AND/OR TRANSPORT BULK CITRUS FRUIT

Farm Labor Contractor (FLC) refers to any person/establishment who employs people to perform work related to grove management and/or harvesting commercial citrus fruit.

Establishment agrees to the following:

1. Establishments Under Compliance

Prior to harvest, the Establishment shall verify all listed below have a valid compliance agreement with the Program.

- a. Grower/Grove Manager of grove to be harvested
- b. Packer/Processor to receive the bulk citrus fruit
- c. Transporter/Hauler (if different from the Establishment)

2. Mitigation Requirements

Establishment shall ensure that all applicable mitigation requirements for moving fruit within or from an Asian citrus psyllid (ACP) bulk citrus regional quarantine zone or huanglongbing (HLB) quarantine area are met. Mitigation requirements can be found on the Grower/Grove Manager Information page:

3. Cleaning Harvesting Equipment

Prior to leaving any growing premises, Establishment shall complete the following:

- a. Harvesting tools, including clippers and bags, must be cleaned free from stems and leaves, and should be disinfected with a cleaner.
- b. Empty harvesting equipment, including containers, bins, forklifts, cleaning machines, etc., used for harvesting and hauling/transporting ACP host fruit, and ensure all equipment is completely free of leaf and stem debris.
- c. All personnel shall ensure their clothing is disinfested and cleaned free from stems and leaves.

5. Transporting Citrus

All shipments of citrus fruit shall be safeguarded throughout the duration of transit, beginning before the vehicle departs the loading site and until it reaches final destination for offloading. Any screen mesh used as an ACP-proof barrier shall be 0.3 square millimeters (e.g. 0.547 mm x 0.547 mm, or 0.5 mm x 0.6 mm) or less in size.

6. Green Waste Disposal

All green waste, including leaf and stem debris, must be left at the harvested grove or disposed of in accordance with the Program, local County Agricultural Commissioner (CAC), under QC Master Permit 1289, or other Program approved manner.

7. Inspection

The Establishment shall allow agricultural officials to inspect and monitor activities conducted by the Establishment to ensure compliance.

8. Records

Maintain records for a minimum period of two years of all citrus groves harvested and shipments to packinghouses/processors and other any other location. The Establishment shall make such records available to Program officials immediately upon request.

9. Training and Information

- a. Establishment shall ensure employees receive training for compliance with all specifications pertaining to this and all other applicable exhibits.
- b. The Establishment shall regularly verify current regional quarantine zones and quarantine requirements. Current information may be viewed at: <u>https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/citrus/pests_diseases/acp/regulation.html</u>.

10. Violation

Violation of any terms of the compliance agreement or this exhibit shall result in the suspension of the compliance agreement until an investigation is completed and for a minimum period of two weeks.
