Subject: Light Brown Apple Moth Federal Order Revocation  
Shipping Guidelines for product to Canada, Mexico, and Domestic

The Light Brown Apple Moth (LBAM) quarantine in California ended December 17, 2021. Although domestic restrictions have been lifted, international shipping requirements are still in effect and trapping activities required for international export must continue until further notice.

Guidance and related documents for each destination is presented below:

**Canada:**

Canadian Directive D-07-03 (Phytosanitary Import Requirements for LBAM) is currently active. See link below:

As a result, the following documents will aide in meeting the directive's stipulations for shipment of product from California.

Compliance Agreements:

- Nursery
- Fruit and Vegetables
- Brassica and Vitis spp.
- Cut Flowers, Decorative Branches and Cut Foliage

Certificate of Origin:

- LBAM Certificate of Origin for non- regulated counties.

A shippers list for fruit and vegetable stakeholders will be maintained. In addition, please follow PEXD for any shipping updates as it relates to LBAM. All noted documents will be available on the CDFA Extranet site under the Interior Pest Exclusion Program page. Link provided below:
