
LEPRINO FOODS COMPANY'S POST-HEARING BRIEF**In the Matter of:**

Proposed changes in the Class 2, 3, 4a and 4b price formulae as provided in the Consolidated Stabilization and Marketing Plan considered at the June 1 & 2, 2006 Hearing held by the California Department of Food and Agriculture in Sacramento, California.

Pending before the Secretary of the California Department of Food and Agriculture ("CDFA" or "Department") are proposed amendments to the Consolidated Stabilization and Marketing Plan concerning changes in the Class 2, 3, 4a and 4b price formulae. The hearing on this matter ("Hearing") was held June 1 and 2 in Sacramento, California. In accordance with California Food and Agricultural Code § 61903, Leprino Foods Company ("Leprino") is submitting this Post-Hearing Brief to clarify its testimony.

The terminology describing protein levels in WPC products is somewhat confusing, specifically as it relates to WPC-34 vs. WPC-35 and WPC-78 vs. WPC-80. Within the industry, WPC-34 and WPC-35 are terms that are used interchangeably. The term "WPC-35" describes the protein content on a dry matter basis whereas the term "WPC-34" describes the protein content on a finished product basis (including the minimal moisture that is in the finished product). The same applies to WPC-78 and WPC-80. The term "WPC-80" describes the protein content on a dry matter basis whereas the term "WPC-78" describes the protein content on a finished product basis (including the minimal moisture that is in the finished product).
