National Commodity Prices for Grade AA Butter and Cheddar Cheese Increase . . .

The minimum price of milk, established by the Department each month, is the price that dairy processors must pay for milk used to produce dairy products. National commodity prices, primarily butter, Cheddar cheese, nonfat dry milk and dry whey, are significant factors in determining the minimum milk price (See national commodities prices chart on page 2).

Compared to last month, the national commodity prices for Grade AA butter and Cheddar cheese increased, while nonfat dry milk and Western Dry Whey prices decreased, consequently all milk prices increased: whole milk increased four and two tenths cents per gallon; reduced fat milk increased three and no tenths cents per gallon; lowfat milk increased two and two tenths cents per gallon; and skim milk increased one and two tenths cents per gallon.

With the start of the fall season, milk production across the U.S. continues to be strong and dairy product production is steady and slightly above last year levels. The production of butter and nonfat dry milk products continues to be higher than last year levels and fluid milk sales should be steady as schools are back in session. High fuel and feed costs continue to have a major effect on the cost of producing milk.

The table below shows individual prices for the four types of fluid milk by container size and the price changes from the previous month. The prices listed represent the minimum price paid by processors for the milk only - no other processing costs are included.
