### **National Dairy Commodity Prices All Increase...**

The minimum price of milk, established by the Department each month, is the price that dairy processors must pay for milk used to produce dairy products. National commodity prices, primarily butter, Cheddar cheese, nonfat dry milk and dry whey, are significant factors in determining the minimum milk price (See national commodities prices chart on page 2).

Compared to last month, the national commodity prices for Grade AA butter, Cheddar cheese, nonfat dry milk and Western Dry Whey increased, consequently all milk prices increased: whole milk increased nine and five tenths cents per gallon; reduced fat milk increased ten and one tenth cents per gallon; lowfat milk increased ten and six tenths cents per gallon; and skim milk increased eight and nine tenths cents per gallon.

Nonfat (Skim)

As spring begins, milk and dairy product production are ramping up, as demand softens. Inventories of Grade AA butter, Cheddar cheese and nonfat dry milk continue to build, the encouraging news is retail sales of natural cheese have remained relatively strong, whereas retail processed cheese and milk sales are recovering from last year's lows. Aggressive retail promotions coupled with the Easter holidays has driven up sales in the cheese category. Restaurant operators are encouraged with sales for the second month in a row and are optimistic about the future. However higher corn prices continue to increase feed costs for dairy producers.

The table below shows individual prices for the four types of fluid milk by container size and the price changes from the previous month. The prices listed represent the minimum price paid by processors for the milk only - no other processing costs are included.
