Minimum Prices for Fluid Milk Increase Slightly ...

The minimum price of milk, established by the Department each month, is the price that dairy processors must pay for milk used to produce dairy products. National commodity prices, primarily butter, Cheddar cheese, nonfat dry milk and dry whey, are significant factors in determining the minimum milk price (See national commodities prices chart on page 2).

Compared to last month, the national commodity prices for Western Dry Whey remained the same and Grade AA Butter decreased, while Cheddar Cheese and Nonfat Dry Milk increased, consequently milk prices increased: whole milk increased four and six tenths cents per gallon; reduced fat milk increased six and six tenths cents per gallon; lowfat milk increased eight and no tenths cents per gallon; and skim milk increased seven and four tenths cents per gallon.

Comparing July to last year, nationwide milk production remainded flat, with decreased production in California and increased production in the Midwest states. Total cheese production was up, butter and nonfat dry milk production were down. Retail sales of cheese were up compared to last year. Retail stores and restaurants are still showing strong demand for cheese. School is in full swing now and milk supplies are tight.

The table below shows individual prices for the four types of fluid milk by container size and the price changes from the previous month. The prices listed represent the minimum price paid by processors for the milk only - no other processing costs are included.
