NOTICE OF MODIFICATIONS OF TEXT OF PROPOSED REGULATION

April 4, 2017

The Department of Food and Agriculture (Department) proposes to promulgate regulations contained in the California Code of Regulations (CCR) for the retail sale of natural gas motor vehicle fuels in California.

Pursuant to the requirements of Government Code § 11346.8 (c) and the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 1, § 44, the Department is providing notice of modifications to the text of the proposed regulation.

These modifications are required for consistency with the 2017 edition of National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Handbook 44 Subsection 3.37. Mass Flow Meters. NIST Handbook 44 is adopted by reference in Business and Professions Code (BPC) § 12107. BPC § 12107 authorizes modifications to the language of NIST Handbook 44 as required to conform to other state laws. NIST Handbook 44 now includes references to liquefied natural gas (LNG) in sections S.1.2 and UR.3.8. Therefore, these sections may be adopted by reference. The other changes are required for consistency with Assembly Bill 1907 (Ridley-Thomas Statutes of 2014, Chapter 805).

As required by the Administrative Procedure Act, the proposed text is presented with markup of the most recent text that was posted on June 24, 2016. Proposed deletions are shown as strikethroughs (~~proposed deletions~~). Text with single underline and strikethrough was a proposed addition to the current regulation now withdrawn from the proposed regulatory text (~~withdrawn text~~). Proposed new additions to the text are shown with double underline (new additions).

Any interested person, or his or her authorized representative, may submit written comments to the Department regarding the proposed changes. Comments may be submitted by mail, fax, or e-mail. If comments are submitted by email, please include 'natural gas fuel regulation' in the subject line. The written comment period closes at 5:00 p.m. on April 19, 2017.
