## CALIFORNIA FUEL ADVERTISING AND LABELING REQUIREMENTS: ALL MUST MATCH

**BRAND** Placement, Size, Appearance - Needs to comply with law and needs to **match** same wording on street and all other "Advertising", "Pump/Dispenser" and "Underground Storage Tanks".

Examples: Chevron, Mobil, Shell, No Brand, Unbranded, etc.

PRODUCT Placement, Size, Appearance - Needs to comply with law and needs to **match** same wording on street and all other "Advertising", "Pump/Dispenser" and "Underground Storage Tanks".


Examples: Gasoline, Diesel (#2), Biodiesel, E-85, etc.

**GRADE** Placement, Size, Appearance - Needs to comply with law and needs to **match** same wording on street and all other "Advertising", "Pump/Dispenser" and "Underground Storage Tanks".

Examples: Unleaded, Plus, Supreme, (Diesel) #2, B20, etc.

California Business and Professions Code Section 13480 states it is unlawful to offer petroleum products for sale without the brand, grade and product displayed and plainly visible on the dispensers and on the inlet end of the fill pipe of each underground storage tank.

California Business and Professions Code Section 13532 states it is unlawful to display any advertising sign which advertises the price of motor fuel unless the sign displays the following:
