Our Clients - Facility Dog Teams

Professionals working in a healthcare, visitation, or educational setting.

Dogs use trained skills designed to motivate and inspire clients with special needs.



Our Clients - Therapy Dog Teams

Owners of Canine Companions released dogs who volunteer with their dogs in specific settings for the benefit of the clients in the setting and/or as part of a therapeutic invention.



Know the Difference

Service Dog

Trained in specific tasks to assist a person with a disability. Generally, allowed anywhere their handlers are permitted, if behaving safely and appropriately.

Facility Dog

Trained in specific tasks to assist professionals working with clients. Not allowed in public places outside of approved facility.

Therapy Dog

Certified pet dogs provide comfort to groups of people. Not allowed in public places

Emotional Support Animal

Pets that provide comfort to individuals with mental health conditions. Not allowed in public places
