

the **COMMUNITY**

Tuolumne County is located in the heart of the California "Mother Lode" gold country region in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada mountain range. Just 125 miles

east of San Francisco, south of Lake Tahoe, and home to Yosemite National Park and the Stanislaus National Forest,

the area abounds with recreational opportunities and beautiful scenery with many lakes, rivers, hiking trails and ski areas within its boundaries. Tuolumne County is rich in California history and visitors can step back in time at Columbia and Railtown 1897 State Historic Parks. A strong arts and cultural presence is felt through the Tuolumne County Arts Alliance, live theater venues, art galleries, special events, and museums. A small community atmosphere is prevalent throughout the County and is the hallmark of Sonora, the county seat and only incorporated city, as well as the towns of Twain Harte, Columbia, Groveland,

Jamestown, and Tuolumne.







the **DEPARTMENTS**

Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights and Measures

4-full-time staff: Deputy Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer, 2-Agricultural Biologists, Administrative Technician. 1 contracted Wildlife Services Specialist. Fiscal Year 18/19 Budget - \$711,500 Administers local enforcement of laws and regulations pertaining to ten California Department of Food and Agriculture

programs plus Weights and Measures, California Department of Pesticide Regulation's pesticide program, and local agricultural use determinations for Williamson Act Contracts. Advises and provides support staff to the County's Agricultural Advisory Committee.

Air Pollution Control District

2-full-time staff: Deputy Air Pollution Control Officer, Air Pollution Control Specialist. Fiscal Year 18/19 Budget - \$972,250

Administers local enforcement of District Rules and air related laws and regulations, for non-mobile pollution sources, primarily found in the Health & Safety Code . Administers multiple Carl Moyer and other grant programs. Advises and supports the Air Pollution Control District's Hearing Board.

Animal Control

9-full-time staff: Animal Control Manager, Supervising Animal Control Officer, 4-Animal Control Officers, Registered Veterinary Technician, 3-Animal Shelter Attendants. Fiscal Year 18/19 Budget - \$912,900 Administers local enforcement of laws and regulations pertinent to domestic animal control and operates an animal shelter.

- Five (5) years of increasingly responsible combined experience in the areas of agriculture, weights and measures, or air pollution control, including at least two years at a supervisory level.

Licenses and Certifications:

- Must possess an Agricultural Commissioner and Deputy Sealer of Weights and Measures license issued by the State of California Department of Food and Agriculture.
- Must be able to obtain Sealer of Weights and Measures license within one year of appointment.
- Must possess a California driver's license and have a satisfactory driving record.
