LATE FEE PENALTY

Effective January 1, 1995, failure to file a return or pay the assessment to comply with Section 6033.5(c) of the Food & Agricultural Code shall result in a penalty of 10% of the amount of the assessment determined to be due, plus the addition of 1.5% interest per month on the unpaid balance of the assessment and penalty.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The full amount of the assessment shall be collected from the producer by the first handler at the point and time the crop is purchased or received by the handler, or in the case of a producer-handler, when the crop is marketed by him.
- 2. To determine the amount of your assessment, multiply the net "Paid" tons of the commodity times the assessment rate for the district in which the commodity was grown. Enter the amount assessed in the right-hand column.
- 3. When reporting container packed crop, use the blue form for conversion to net tons.

DEFINITIONS

- Handler means any person who engages in the operation of selling, marketing, or processing any of the crops vulnerable to damage from curly top virus, which he has purchased or acquired from a producer or which he is marketing, selling or processing on behalf of a producer, whether as owner, agent, employee or otherwise.
- 2. Producer-handler means a producer who operates as handler for any of the crops produced by him.
- 3. Producer means any person who owns or shares in the proceeds of a crop subject to payment of the assessment.

Assessment forms will be mailed by the 20th of the month.
