

Exhibit: SOS – N

Nursery with an Approved Structure

Provisions for the movement of sweet orange scab (SOS) regulated nursery stock grown inside of an SOS Program approved structure.

Establishment agrees to the following:

1. Approved Structure

Establishment shall ensure all sweet orange scab (SOS) host nursery stock propagated, grown, and/or maintained on the property is housed in an approved facility that is kept in good repair without any tears or gaps.

2. Shipping Regulated Nursery Stock

Establishment may move, ship, sell, or distribute regulated nursery stock grown and maintained in an approved structure if all the following criteria are met:

- a. Establishment shall ensure all regulated nursery stock originates from at least one of the following:
 - i. Citrus Clonal Protection Program stock;
 - ii. Registered mother trees; or
 - iii. Registered trees.
- b. The identity of each shipment of regulated nursery stock is maintained with an individually numbered shipment ticket created by the nursery containing the following information:
 - i. Name of nursery, landowner agent, or lessee
 - ii. Origin address
 - iii. License tag number
 - iv. Number of plants contained in the shipment
 - v. Destination address
 - vi. Date of shipment
- c. Establishment shall notify the Program at least 48 hours in advance of all shipments of nursery stock under this exhibit. If all the following requirements are met, the Establishment may ship eligible nursery stock to non-SOS quarantined area(s).
 - i. The Establishment shall self-certify the nursery stock verifying that all stipulations of this compliance agreement exhibit are met.
 - ii. Self-certified shipments of nursery stock shall be accompanied by a copy of the applicable completed Exhibit QC-C and treatment log.

3. Infested Nursery Stock

- a. Establishment shall hold all nursery stock suspected to be infected with SOS and shall notify the SOS Program immediately.
- b. Suspect nursery stock shall be tagged and segregated. Nursery stock may be voluntarily destroyed under SOS Program supervision.
- c. If lab results are negative for SOS, all nursery stock will be released from hold.
- d. If lab results are positive for SOS, the following will be implemented:
 - i. All confirmed positive SOS infected nursery stock shall be destroyed.
 - ii. All other regulated nursery stock will remain on hold.
 - iii. Establishment shall not apply fungicides that may mask any SOS symptoms.

- iv. SOS Program may conduct a follow-up inspection.
 - If all plants are asymptomatic, the plants may be released from hold.
 - If suspected SOS positive plants are found, Number 3 (a-d) of this exhibit shall be implemented.

4. Inspections

Allow SOS Program officials to inspect the premises to ensure compliance with this agreement.

5. Records

Maintain records for a minimum of three years of all SOS host and green waste shipments leaving the premises. Establishment shall make such records available to SOS Program officials immediately upon request.

6. Training

Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of the compliance agreement and this exhibit.

7. Information Posting

Establishment shall display informative posters and associated SOS information in a conspicuous location if supplied by the SOS Program.

8. Violation

Violation of any terms of the compliance agreement or this exhibit shall result in the immediate suspension of the compliance agreement until an investigation is completed and for a minimum period of two weeks. The compliance agreement may be reinstated at the discretion of the SOS Program and upon Establishment's satisfactory demonstration that all compliance measures are met.
