

ADDITIONAL GRAPE CRUSH AND PURCHASE INQUIRY INSTRUCTIONS

Includes Examples of Various Scenarios
(Provided to assist you in completing your inquiry.)

1. The questionnaire **MUST** be returned by January 10, 2023.
2. Report Tonnage Purchased and Crushed for Concentrate Production.
3. Record Tonnage on the “Data Page” to the nearest **TENTH**.
4. Record Base and Weighted Average Prices to the nearest **PENNY**.
5. Base and Weighted Average Prices reported in columns 8 and 16 **should not** be based on the Preliminary and/or Final Grape Crush Report for the **current production year**.
 - a. *CALIFORNIA FOOD AND AGRICULTURAL CODE 55601.5 (g): All grape purchase contracts, entered into on or after January 1, 1977, shall provide for a final price, including any bonuses or allowances, to be set on or before the January 10 following delivery of the grapes purchased. Any grape purchase contract entered into in violation of this subdivision is illegal and unenforceable. For the purpose of this section, a grape purchase contract shall not include any existing supply contract between a nonprofit cooperative association and a commercial processor.*
6. **REMINDER:** include **local hauling allowances** normally paid to growers in **BOTH** the Base Price reported in Column 8 and the Weighted Average Price reported in Column 16.
