Page 15 of the RGA encourages WETA awardees to share their distribution uniformity (DU) results with ITRC, but does not require it. Female farmers and ranchers of color are considered socially disadvantaged. For more information and context please see CDFA's Farm Equity Report. CDFA staff within the OEFI and scientific staff at other state agencies may participate in the technical review process to determine the highest scoring applications for awarding grant funding.
