



Stop the Glassy-Winged Sharpshooter

The glassy-winged sharpshooter (GWSS) is an invasive pest that can damage plants in your yard and community.

It spreads a disease that **kills plants** and **threatens California's agriculture**, including **grapes, wine and citrus**.

PLANTS AT RISK

- **Fruits and Crops:** grape, citrus, stone fruit, almond
- **Landscape Plants:** oleander, crape myrtle, privet and more
- **Shade Trees:** oak, elm, maple, sycamore and more

WHAT YOU CAN DO



Don't move plants in or out of the area to prevent spreading pests



Report signs of pests or plant diseases to the CDFA Pest Hotline (1-800-491-1899) or the county agricultural commissioner




Buy plants locally from licensed nurseries or retailers




Work with agricultural officials: allow access to your yard to place traps, inspect plants and conduct treatments, if needed
