

Grevillea psyllid (*Acizzia hakeae*)

- ❑ Widespread in southern CA; probably introduced from Australia or New Zealand.
- ❑ Hosts: In CA recorded from *Grevillea* and *Hakea* spp., including *Hakea suaveolens*, *Grevillea 'Noellii'*, and *G. banksii* (Proteaceae).
- ❑ Field ID: Similar in appearance to Acacia psyllid but Grevillea psyllid not found on acacia. All stages (eggs, larvae, adults) found among leaflets of abnormal growth. Adult 3 mm long, slender, pale brown with areas of orange and yellow, and **spotted wings**. Larva yellow and free-living.
