This regular rulemaking action amends six sections of plant quarantine regulations by replacing host lists for Mediterranean Fruit Fly (Ceratitis capitata), Peach Fruit Fly (Bactrocera zonata), Melon Fruit Fly (Bactrocera cucurbitae), Sweetpotato Weevil (Cylas formicarius elegantulus), Guava Fruit Fly (Bactrocera correcta), and Malaysian Fruit Fly (Bactrocera latifrons) printed in those sections with cross-references to where substantively identical host lists for these pests already appear in existing insect pest control eradication area regulations within title 3 of the California Code of Regulations.

OAL approves this regulatory action pursuant to section 11349.3 of the Government Code. This regulatory action becomes effective on 7/1/2024.

(c) Commodities Covered.

(1) All fruit (including nuts and berries), vegetables (other than leafy types grown above ground), and the fruiting bodies of the plants listed hereinin Title 3, California Code of Regulations, Section 3591.5 (b). All these items that are infested or are exposed to infestation by Mediterranean fruit fly are declared a public nuisance. Unless proven otherwise, all cultivars, varieties, and hybrids of the plant species listed hereinin Title 3, California Code of Regulations, Section 3591.5 (b) are considered suitable hosts of Ceratitis capitata.
