NOTICE OF A PROPOSED EMERGENCY ACTION

5-Day Notice

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Department of Food and Agriculture (Department) is proposing to take the action described in the Informative Digest as included in the Finding of Emergency. The California Department of Food and Agriculture (Department) proposes to adopt Section 3290 Cotton Jassid (Two-Spotted Leafhopper) Exterior Quarantine of Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations. The effect will be to create an exterior quarantine to protect California from the invasive pest cotton jassid.

AUTHORITY

The Department proposes to adopt Section 3290 pursuant to the authority vested by sections 407, 5301, 5302 and 5311 of the Food and Agricultural Code of California. Reference: Sections 5024, 5301, 5311, 5701, 6403, 6441, 6442 and 6461, Food and Agricultural Code.

Sections Affected: Section 3290 of Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations.

Five Working Day Notice of OAL Comment Period: Government Code section 11346.1(a)(2) requires that, at least five working days prior to submission of the proposed emergency action to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), the adopting agency provide a notice of the proposed emergency action to every person who has filed a request for notice of regulatory action with the agency. After submission of the proposed emergency regulation to OAL, OAL shall allow interested persons five calendar days to submit comments on the proposed emergency regulations as set forth in Government Code section 11349.6. Upon the Department submitting the proposed regulation to OAL, OAL will have ten (10) calendar days within which to review and make a decision on the proposed emergency rule. If approved, OAL will file the regulations with the Secretary of State, and the emergency regulations will become effective for one hundred and eighty (180) days. Within the 180-day effective period, the Department will proceed with a regular rulemaking, including a public comment period. The emergency regulations will remain in effect during the regular rulemaking action.

Attached to this notice is the specific regulatory language of the proposed emergency action and Finding of Emergency.
