
HLB Detections

Citrus Division Updates

Revised Strategic Planning

- Focus in ag/urban interface near commercial citrus
- De-prioritize HLB response in ultra-urban areas
 - Continue to remove HLB-positive trees
- Reduced Citrus Division staffing

Illicit Nurseries

- Home/backyard nurseries and roadside vendors in the HLBQ
 - Illegal citrus importation and/or propagation
- Last 3 years in LA/Orange Counties
 - 42 encounters
 - Almost 1,800 trees confiscated
- San Diego nursery
 - 242 citrus trees from Florida
 - Propagating from outdoor, in-ground trees



HLB Nursery Rule Modification

Current Status

- No outdoor citrus within HLB quarantine
 - 12 nurseries within HLBQ with an approved structure
- Increased market for illicit nurseries and roadside vendors

Systems Approach Modification

- Citrus eligible for sale in LA/OC HLBQ under a signed compliance agreement
- Citrus must be
 - Maintained inside a building
 - Destroyed 90 days after treatment
