CALIFORNIA NURSERY STOCK CERTIFICATE

GUIDELINES FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION

The use of a California Nursery Stock Certificate (CNSC) may be suspended or revoked for cause. A request for suspension or revocation of a nursery's CNSC from the local County Agricultural Commissioner (CAC) will be reviewed by the State prior to implementation. A finding of suspension or revocation is appealable to the Secretary of Agriculture per Food and Agricultural Code Section 5103.

SUSPENSION:

Authorization for use of a CNSC may be suspended:

- 1. Immediately with the detection of a quarantine pest. Upon completion of a risk assessment, use of a CNSC may be reinstated for use with such nursery stock where there is no risk for movement of the pest.
- 2. If a nursery knowingly moves plant material that does not meet the standards of cleanliness.
- 3. For repeated incidences of non-compliance. Note: If suspension is being considered based on incidence(s) of non-compliance, the nursery may request to meet with the local CAC to discuss the pending action.

REVOCATION:

The following violations may result in multiple enforcement actions including the revocation of a nursery's CNSC, the nursery's license to sell stock and the issuance of administrative fines:

- 1. Knowingly moving plant material that is under guarantine hold
- 2. Knowingly moving plant material that has a quarantine pest
- 3. Falsifying required documentation such as shipping and receiving documents and origin certificates
- 4. History of repeated suspensions
- 5. Egregious violations of the Food and Agricultural Code and quarantine regulations
